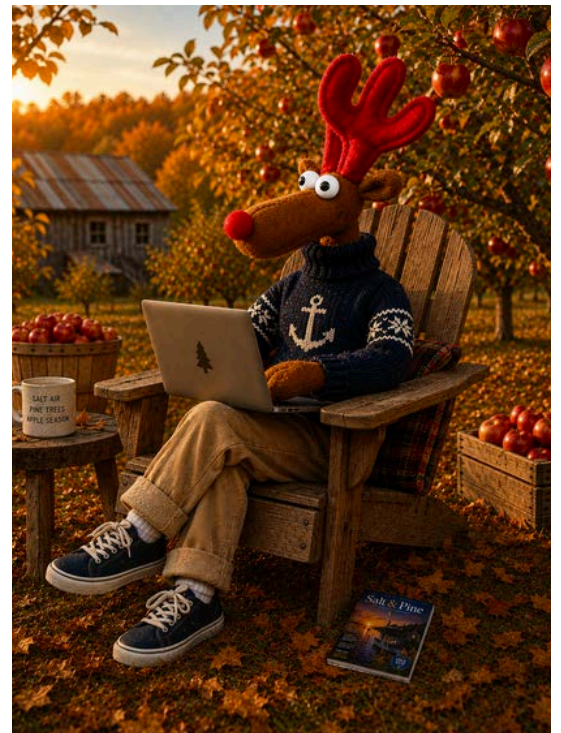

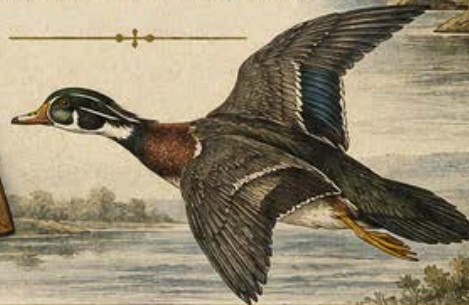

Small Town Spotlight: Camden

The Night Camden Burned and the Town That Rose Again

On the night of November 10, 1892, Camden changed forever. A fire broke out in the downtown business district and, driven by a fierce easterly wind, quickly swept through streets lined largely with wooden buildings. Firefighters struggled with inadequate water pressure as the flames spread across Main, Elm, Mechanic, and Washington streets. By the time it was over, 40 commercial buildings and 18 homes had been destroyed, including stores, meeting halls, and the town's old opera house.

But Camden wasted little time rebuilding. In 1893, merchants and town leaders began replacing much of what had been lost with substantial brick and stone buildings, creating a safer and more unified downtown. Among the landmarks to emerge from the rebuilding was the Camden Opera House, which remains a centerpiece of the community. Today, many of the handsome buildings lining Main and Elm streets are part of the Camden Great Fire Historic District—a lasting reminder that much of the downtown charm visitors admire today was born from one of the darkest nights in Camden's history.

10 Top Places to See in Camden



1. Mt. Battie Tower — Probably Camden's signature viewpoint. From the summit, you get the classic postcard view of Camden Harbor, Penobscot Bay and the islands. The 1921 stone tower is also a WWI memorial.
2. Camden Harbor — The heart of Camden, filled with schooners, windjammers and sailboats. The Camden Town Landing is a great place to watch boats and explore the waterfront.
3. Camden Hills State Park — One of Maine's great coastal parks, with hiking, mountain views and the famous Mt. Battie panorama. On a clear day, you can even see toward Cadillac Mountain in Acadia.
4. Camden Public Library & Harbor Park — One of the prettiest areas in downtown Camden, with landscaped grounds overlooking the harbor.
5. Curtis Island Lighthouse — The picturesque lighthouse guarding the entrance to Camden Harbor. It has stood there since 1836 and is particularly beautiful when seen from the water or the town's Curtis Island Overlook.
6. Downtown Camden — Main Street and Bay View Street are worth including simply for the classic small-town atmosphere: historic buildings, shops, restaurants and glimpses of the harbor.
7. Megunticook Falls — A small waterfall right in downtown that empties toward Camden Harbor. It's an easy-to-miss feature that makes Camden particularly unusual.
8. Mount Megunticook — For hikers, the Ocean Lookout provides another spectacular view over Camden and Penobscot Bay.
9. Ragged Mountain / Camden Snow Bowl — A four-season recreation area famous for skiing with views toward the ocean and for Camden's historic wooden toboggan chute.
10. Maiden Cliff — A dramatic hike overlooking Megunticook Lake, recognizable by the memorial cross near the ledges. A great area for rock climbers.

The View That Inspired a Poet

Visitors can literally stand on Mt. Battie and look across the same landscape that helped inspire a young woman from Camden on her way to becoming a Pulitzer Prize-winning poet.



Edna St. Vincent Millay's connection to Camden is much deeper than simply having lived there—Camden is where she grew up as a writer and where her literary career began. Although she was born in Rockland in 1892, Millay lived in Camden from 1903 to 1913. She graduated from Camden High School in 1909, edited the school publication *Megunticook*, acted in local plays, studied piano, and began publishing poetry while still a teenager.

Camden Inspired Her Breakthrough Poem

The Camden landscape also became part of Millay's poetry. She frequently climbed Mt. Battie, and its sweeping view of the mountains, Penobscot Bay, and distant islands inspired the opening of her celebrated poem "Renaissance." Written when she was about 20, the poem was published in *The Lyric Year* in 1912 and brought her national attention. That same year, she recited "Renaissance" at Camden's Whitehall Inn; the performance helped attract the attention and support that eventually enabled her to attend Vassar College.

Millay went on to become one of America's best-known poets and won the Pulitzer Prize for Poetry in 1923 for *The Ballad of the Harp-Weaver*. Camden still celebrates her legacy: a statue of Millay stands in Harbor Park, a plaque honoring her can be found atop Mt. Battie, and the Camden Public Library's Walsh History Center preserves photographs, letters, clippings, and other materials relating to her Camden years.

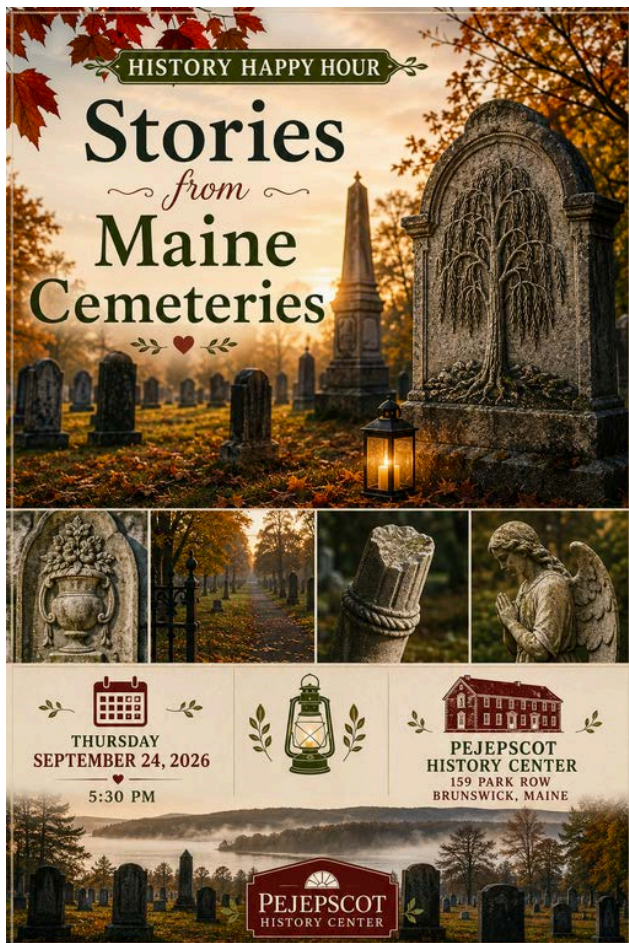

Salt & Pine Tip: Reserve museum passes early. Availability and reservation policies vary by library.

Most libraries allow advance reservations for museum passes, and many are available only in limited quantities each day. Summer weekends and fall foliage season are especially popular, so reserve your pass early. Policies vary by library, and you typically need to be a library cardholder in good standing to borrow a pass.

Many libraries allow you to reserve passes online or by phone 30 days in advance, but popular destinations—especially Coastal Maine Botanical Gardens during the Gardens Aglow season and summer weekends—can book quickly. It's a good idea to reserve early.

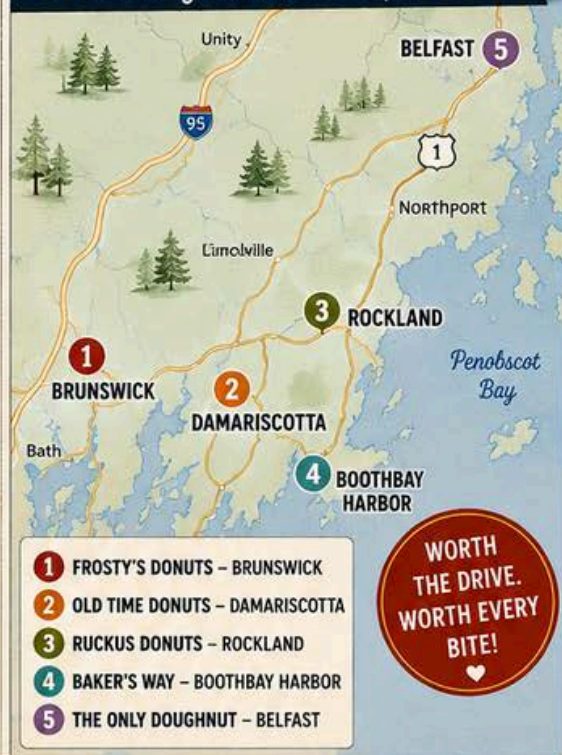

25,000 Mums: A Midcoast Sign of Fall

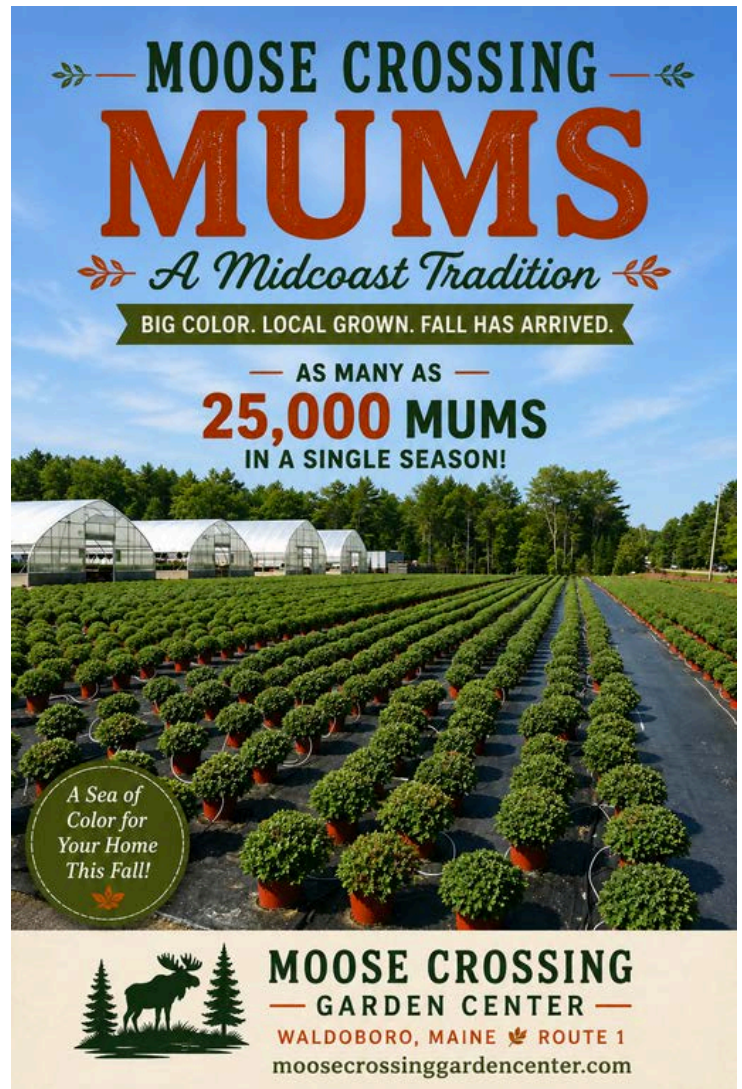
You know fall is on its way when the mums begin appearing at Moose Crossing Garden Center in Waldoboro. Each season, the Route 1 garden center transforms into a sea of autumn color, with rows upon rows of chrysanthemums creating a spectacular display of reds, oranges, yellows, purples and warm harvest tones.

And this isn't a small operation. In one documented season, Moose Crossing filled its outdoor growing area with 25,000 pots of mums—and sold all 25,000 in just six weeks, with about 90 percent purchased by retail customers. The scale makes sense: the Lupien family has been growing plants in Midcoast Maine since 1973, expanding from one small greenhouse to 19 greenhouses and roughly 80,000 square feet of growing and retail space.

For many Midcoast gardeners, including me, a September trip to Moose Crossing has become part of the rhythm of the season. Pick a mum—or several—load up the car, and suddenly the front porch looks like fall in Maine.

Salt & Pine Tip: Go early in the season for the biggest selection. And bring room in the car—you may arrive planning to buy one mum and leave with considerably more.

How many mums are left? At Moose Crossing Garden Center in Waldoboro, the roadside sign tells the story of fall, one mum at a time. With thousands of locally grown mums filling the fields each season, watching that number tick down has become part of the fun. 15,023 and counting... down!
